In Chinese culture, red is an auspicious colour and symbolizes success, prosperity, good luck and happiness, and is prominently featured during the Chinese New Year period. People wear red outfits, decorate their homes with red objects like lanterns or door couplets, and give out red packets and gifts that are red in colour. The bright red colour and perfectly round shape of cherries make them visually pleasing, but not only are they good lookers, they also taste great and are high in vitamin C. Once considered a luxury fruit only afforded by Chinese aristocrats, they are now a popular gift to be given to loved ones during the Chinese New Year period – perfect timing as the Chilean cherry season starts in November. Chilean cherries are highly sought after thanks to their superior quality and taste, and a mature and stable supply chain has helped Chilean cherries gain a foothold in China.

According to the Chilean Fruit Exporters Association, Chilean cherry exports hit a record high of 356,348 metric tons during the 2021/2022 season despite the challenges posed by the Covid-19 pandemic. The export growth estimation for this season is projected at 19% and reaching 424,880 tons, of which China will continue as the main destination. Cherries do not have a long shelf life and are prone to damage if there are delays in transport, hence the time sensitive nature raises the need for fast and reliable transport which is key to ensure that the fruit arrives in the best possible condition. To meet this need, ONE has implemented a temporary change in port rotation and faster sailing speed, thus demonstrating its commitment to the perishable produce industry and flexibility to adapt to new challenges by providing innovative solutions.
